RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

LOOKING AHEAD: February 2014

Just as our world has special times and seasons, so too does the Church. In our liturgical calendar we remember important parts of the Christian story and wait for the time when Christ will come again.

During February, there is still a feeling of 'New Year' in the air. The Church's 'New Year' began in Advent last year. The season of Christmas followed and closed on January 12. Until Lent begins with Ash Wednesday (5th March) we are in the first part of *Ordinary Time*. This does not mean that the season is 'ordinary' but simply that each week will be counted in order.

As Sunday is the weekly commemoration of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, it stands as the focus of our week. Therefore, the Sundays are counted and called 'First Sunday in Ordinary Time', 'Second Sunday in Ordinary Time' etc.

Last Sunday marked the beginning of the 4th Week in Ordinary Time.



<u>NOTE:</u> The liturgical colour for Ordinary Time is green - the colour of life and hope.

(You will notice Fr Kerry's vestments at mass during this time are green as are the banners and decorations in the Church.)

Throughout the weeks of Ordinary Time, we also keep holy the memory of Mary (Mother of God), the apostles, the martyrs and all the saints. Our liturgical traditions present these women and men as intercessors or models. In children's terms saints in particular, are kind of like 'big brothers and sisters' in faith. They were canonized not because they were perfect, but because they displayed specific virtues that the Church recognizes as important to fulfill its mission.

As we gather to celebrate our **Opening School Mass** this **Wednesday 5th February** we will also celebrate the memorial of **St. Agatha**. Venerated in Rome as a virgin martyr, on this day she is remembered for her great faith and for remaining resolute under torture. Agatha's story is certainly no fairytale.

It is rather, a story of tragedy and brutality. It is believed that she was a beautiful young woman from a distinguished family, who instead of marrying, chose to remain pure as a sign of her complete devotion to Jesus Christ. In the midst of the cruelty she suffered before being put to death, Agatha demonstrated the outstanding virtues of fidelity to the body of Christ and courage under pressure. It is her courage that is an excellent example for us today. So whether it is the courage to stand up for what we believe in, the courage to try something new or the courage to try again after disappointment we can certainly learn from the life of St. Agatha.

RE\$OURCE LEVY

All students received their books last week. The school charges **\$120** per child in Years 1 – 7 and \$150 per child in Prep.

Payment of the Resource Levy must be paid by the <u>end of February</u> to enable us to pay our accounts. If you are experiencing difficulties please contact the school office.

Parents who are direct debiting fees on a weekly/fortnightly basis are asked to please pay the resource levy either by EFT or into the school office, either by cash or cheque made out to the school.

ACTIVITY LEVY

In 2014 the Activity Levy will only be charged in Terms 2, 3 and 4. From Term 2 you will have the Activity Levy included on your School Fees Invoice. This levy will cover the cost of all activities such as concerts, sport, swimming etc. There may be occasion that an activity becomes available to the students that was not a planned activity; this cost will be added to the following term's levy, with the exception of Term 4, in which case separate payment will be requested.

INSTRUMENTAL PROGRAM YRS 3-7

If your child wishes to continue with the instrumental program or a student wishes to commence learning an instrument, please collect an enrolment form from the office counter.

Lessons this year are \$15 per week. Payment may be made weekly to the office or an account will be issued at the end of each term. If your child needs to hire an instrument, the hiring cost is \$20 per term. This MUST be paid at the beginning of each term. This covers ongoing maintenance. INSTRUMENTAL LESSONS WILL NOT BE COMMENCING UNTIL WEEK 5 OF THIS TERM.

PLEASE NOTE - This service is being provided by an instrumental teacher from Good Counsel College and we are ONLY AGENTS. If instrumental accounts are not promptly paid with the allocated period, lessons will cease.

NEW TUCKSHOP PROCEDURES

You will see that there is a greater selection of food items available. Please visit the site and print out the menu as you need them. Your child will not be sent home with a form each week, however there will be forms available in the classrooms for your child to take. Other than this, the procedures to order and pay for the tuckshop have not changed. Orders still need to be in by Wednesdays at 3pm. You will still receive notifications in the newsletter if there is to be no tuckshop due to school Please watch out for these events. notifications.
