## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

#### EXPERIENCING AND EXPRESSING OUR FAITH

Last week saw two wonderful celebrations of our faith within the St. Rita's community. Firstly, our Opening Mass on Wednesday morning was well attended and was a very positive and uplifting way to begin our school year. The children were exceptionally well behaved, sang beautifully and responded respectfully to the various parts of the liturgy. For this they should be commended. Then, on Friday morning our first School Assembly was held which saw our new school leaders facilitate a reverent and welcoming gathering. Listening to the Gospel story was again a simple way to remind us of the special part our beliefs play in our day-to-day life here at St. Rita's. A highlight of the morning was, as always, the introduction of the prep students to the school community. Thank you to the parents who attended these occasions, it is always wonderful to have you join with us. For those of you who may have missed these two celebrations there will be plenty more opportunities in the coming weeks.

We will endeavour to hold assemblies every fortnight and we will come together again for mass on Ash Wednesday (5<sup>th</sup> March).

In helping the children prepare for last week's liturgy the question was asked as to whether or not it would be alright to wear a cross to mass. Of course, the reply was a resounding 'yes'. In fact, a cross can be worn anytime.

For Christians around the world the cross is an important and powerful symbol. It is a universal identifier of one's faith. It is a sign that reminds us of suffering and defeat but also triumph and salvation. While there are many different types/styles of crosses and each have their own special meaning or significance, the message is basically the same. This simple geometric shape has been in existence for 2000 years and is still 'going strong'. On this point, the question has been raised: What would Coca-Cola or McDonald's give to own a symbol that countless millions of people wear around their necks everyday?

With this in mind and especially as we are approaching the season of Easter, the following reflection seems rather appropriate.

#### THE CROSS IN MY POCKET

I carry a cross in my pocket A simple reminder to me Of the fact that I am a Christian No matter where I may be.

This little cross is not magic Nor is it a good luck charm. It isn't meant to protect me From every physical harm.

It's not for identification For all the world to see. It's simply an understanding Between my Saviour and me.
