An example is, if you have one child in the school if you set up a weekly repayment to the end of the calendar year, you would pay approximately \$29 per week and the debt would be repaid by 31<sup>st</sup> December. This does not include our new activity levy.

This Friday we will have Soccer FNQ in the school as part of the IGA Grass Roots program. They will work with all classes.

## <u>PC - 2014</u>

With the beginning of Lent only a couple of weeks away it is an important time to start thinking about/preparing for how we as Catholics can use this special season to 'practise what we preach', so to speak. Traditionally, Lent is a time when we basically are encouraged to think less of ourselves and more of others. It is a time to be more 'Jesus –like'. With this in mind, St. Rita's will once again make a commitment to assist Caritas Australia with its annual appeal known as **Project Compassion**.



FYI : Caritas Australia is the international aid and development organization of the Catholic Church in Australia. Through its long-term programs Caritas Australia helps people help themselves regardless of ethnicity, religion or political beliefs.

The word 'caritas' is Latin for love and compassion. These two qualities are central to the agency's work as they strive for the creation of a just world.

Caritas Australia works with the poorest of the poor, in over 30 countries around the world.

Many of you will be familiar with the work of Caritas Australia and in particular their Project Compassion campaign as our school has participated in many associated activities in previous years. Generally, the aim of the program is twofold. Firstly, it seeks to raise an awareness of the poor and the situations in which they live and secondly, it encourages the action of fundraising as a response. Both elements are essential if we are to be agents of change in our world.

#### JUST LEADERSHIP DAY

Last Thursday our year 6 and 7 leaders attended a 'Just Leadership Day' at Good Counsel Primary School. This day was an initiative of Caritas

Australia that sought to foster an awareness and empathy for social justice in our world. While it was an opportunity to meet school leaders from the other Catholic primary schools in the Southern Deanery, more importantly, it was a chance to reflect on the ways in which they could be effective leaders who could build a more just and fair world.

After many group activities, much discussion and several very compelling multimedia presentations the children decided that supporting the work of Caritas Australia would certainly be a worthy cause and they promptly began writing a list of possible fundraising activities. Upon their return to school that afternoon the 11 students very eagerly shared the experience with their classmates and it was quite amazing to hear the information that they recalled and what they believed the overall message of the day was.

The most startling statistic recalled was that : 75% of the world's population live on less than \$1.25 a day Many remembered that the work of Caritas Australia was described as :

A 'hand up' and not a 'hand out' All were unanimous in proclaiming that they themselves : Live a very fortunate life. And as a whole they agreed that:

As followers of Jesus we are called to help those in need.

#### EAMON SHARKEY VISIT

This Wednesday (19<sup>th</sup> February) Eamon Sharkey will present a talk to our year 3 to 7 children about the work of Caritas Australia and in particular the program for Project Compassion this year. Eamon is the Appeals Coordinator and manages all direct mail fundraising campaigns to supporters across the country. Having travelled through much of South America, Eamon has seen the impact of deeply entrenched poverty, and was inspired by the strength and resilience he witnessed in so many vulnerable communities.

This talk will be held in the little school hall at 1.30-2.30 pm. Parents are very welcome to attend. It is sure to be an engaging and informative presentation.
