ST. PATRICK -PATRON SAINT OF IRELAND: An amazing man, an amazing life

St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland is one of the world's most popular saints. But for all

his celebrity his life remains somewhat of a mystery. There are many legends and stories of St. Patrick including the famous account that he is responsible for banishing all the snakes from Ireland.

What is known for sure is that he was born in Britain to wealthy parents near the end of the fourth century and he is believed to have died on 17 March around 460 AD. Although his father was a Christian Deacon, it has been suggested that he took on this role for tax incentives and that there is no evidence that Patrick came from a particularly religious family.

At the age of about fourteen Patrick was taken prisoner by a group of Irish raiders who attacked his family's estate. They transported him to Ireland where he spent six years in captivity. During this time he worked as a shepherd, outdoors and away from people.

Lonely and afraid he turned to his religion for solace, becoming a devout Christian. (It is also believed that Patrick first began to dream about converting the Irish people to Christianity during his captivity.)

After more than six years, Patrick escaped and returned to Britain. According to his writing – a voice which he believed to be God's, spoke to him in a dream and told him to leave Ireland. After this Patrick reported that he experienced a second revelation – an angel in a dream told him to return to Ireland as a missionary.

Soon after Patrick began religious training, a course of study that lasted about 15 years. Following his ordination as a priest, he was sent to Ireland with a dual mission – to minister to the Christians already living in Ireland and to convert the Irish.

St Patrick is well remembered as a man of great faith. It is said that he often used the shamrock to teach people about the Trinity – God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.

Patrick was a humble, pious and gentle man whose love and total devotion to and trust in God is a shining example to each of us. He feared nothing, not even death, so complete was his faith in God and the importance of his mission.

ARCHIE FROM THE PHILIPPINES

For most of Archie's Life, he lived with his parents and nine siblings in a one-roomed house beside the Plaridel River in the Province of Bulacan, an area prone to flooding and typhoons. "Our roof had holes in it. So when it rained,

*it was like we were having a shower," he said.*Archie experienced severe flooding three times, including September 2009's Super Typhoon Ondoy.

"After this typhoon, our house looked like it had been torn apart by a wild beast. Mud covered every all and corner, the plywood walls were dismantled, the roof was gone and the posts were bent."

In August 2012, an emergency resettlement program supported by Caritas Australia helped the family resettle into permanent and secure housing away from the flood prone river. Through the program, Archie's mum learnt to make bags and he learnt to make candles. But, as he left school halfway through his first year, what he's most excited about is studying under Caritas Australia's Alternative Learning System — a non-formal community based education program which will increase his future prospects.

" Caritas Australia has changed our lives,"said Archie.
