RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST:



What significance does eating and drinking have in your life? Is it a pleasure or a chore? When do you gather with others to share food and drink? Who are the people you gather with on these occasions?

These few basic questions highlight the importance of food in our lives for physical survival and communal bonding. Bread has long been considered a staple food and along with water is a simple yet nourishing and satisfying necessity of life.

Sunday was the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Here we celebrate the tradition and belief in the body and blood of Jesus and his real presence in the Eucharist. In short, it is the commemoration of the institution of this sacrament. It is the Church's official act of homage and gratitude to Christ who by instituting the Holy Eucharist gave to the Church its greatest gift.

When speaking of the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, Pope Francis said,

"Jesus provides the food people need, or rather, he is the living bread that gives life to the world. His body is real food under the species of bread; his blood is real drink under the species of wine."

Living the Catholic faith, the Pope added means, "
allowing yourself to be nourished by the Lord and
building your life not on material goods, but on
the reality that does not perish: the gifts of
God, his word and his body."

Did you know?

- Gathering together to break bread and share the cup is the most ancient practice of the Church.
- In about the year 56 Paul wrote a description of 'The Lord's Supper' in 1 Corinthians (11:23)
- This feast, which used to be known as 'Corpus Christi' originated in the Middle Ages as a celebration of the real presence of Christ in the Eucharistic bread

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

This Friday during the Prep to Yr 3 /4 class liturgy Kari and Eden Cini will receive the Sacrament of Baptism. Here both girls will become members of our Catholic Church. This will take place in the St. Rita's Church at 10.30am and all parents are welcome to join us.

While the Church has an extended rite of Baptism which is normally celebrated, and includes roles of both parents and godparents, the essentials of the rite are two-fold: the pouring of water over the head of the person to be baptised; and the words, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."





Baptism is the first of the three <u>Sacraments of</u>


