Dear Parents and Caregivers

Let me ask you a question - "Would you let a stranger into your child's bedroom?" Last weekend I was fortunate to attend the Queensland Parent and Friends Conference in Cairns. As part of the conference Susan McLean, Australia's foremost expert in the area of cyber-safety and young people, spoke to the parents about this very question. She suggested getting technology out of children's bedrooms and into an area of the house where parents can monitor their usage.

Susan talked about popular sites for kids. Sites such as Facebook, Instagram, kids games such as Club Penguin & Minecraft, Twitter and the dangers of online games such as World of Warcraft. I am told that some of our senior children have an app called KiK. Legally a person has to be 17 to have this app. Susan was adamant that younger children should not have access to this app as it has a number of adult only aspects embedded in it.

Susan wanted to make people aware of privacy settings and location services in relation to these networking sites. Make sure that information is for friends only and that location services were turned off so that predators could not easily locate where the device was being used from. A predator can gain all they need to know in as little as five questions. Parents should be parents and say "NO!" Go into the restriction settings and set them to what you want.

She was not suggesting that we punish our children by taking technology away from them as this is the world in which they live. She did however want us to make our children tech savvy and aware of their "digital footprint". Snapchat photos do not get lost after fifteen seconds, they are easily retrieved off the device if need be by different agencies. The internet and the various applications are a lot of fun and a wonderful tool ... maximize the benefits and surf safely together.

It was wonderful to see so many of our littlies out there and taking part in the Football Club. There are still seven spots left for anyone who is interested.

At last night's P & F meeting the issue was raised of extra traffic starting to pass the school with the introduction of at least 40 iron ore trucks on the way to the harbor each day. We are going to pen a petition to the local council to see if they will do something with the parking in Driscoll Street as a safe alternative, now that we have the covered walkway, to parking at the front of the school in Green Street. I will notify parents and interested community members when it is ready to come in and sign. .

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

EASTER 101:

A Fifty Day Celebration

As you know Easter is the commemoration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead, three days after his crucifixion. This event, that was foreshadowed in the Old Testament and by Jesus himself, is the cornerstone of our Catholic faith. By remembering Christ's resurrection, we become aware that we too will rise again.

In his first Easter message last March, Pope Francis said that Easter means that, *"the love of God is stronger than evil and death itself; it means that the love of God can transform our lives and let those desert places in our hearts bloom. Easter is the exodus, the passage of human beings from the slavery of sin and evil to the freedom of love and goodness."*



It is little wonder then why we celebrate this important season for 50 days. On this note theologian Nathan Mitchell writes, *"the great fifty days are not an unwelcome, unrealistic obligation to 'party on' even if we don't feel like it, but an invitation to explore more deeply the 'weather of the heart' to awaken our memory of God's presence and power in our lives."*

So while Easter does not really have the commercial impact of Christmas and we don't really get an extra day holiday as it always falls

on a Sunday, it is nonetheless an extremely important time for all Catholics because it is an opportunity for listening and for learning.

During this season many stories in the gospels tell of Jesus appearing to the disciples after his resurrection. Each visit strengthened the disciples faith that Jesus had truly risen, and that he was truly the Messiah. Jesus also hands on to them his own mission. This mission to be messengers that the first disciples received, is also given to us. So when we here the gospel words of Jesus today, they are being spoken to us.
