## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

### GOSPEL CONNECTIONS:

#### **THE WEDDING FEAST AT CANA**

Last Sunday's gospel story was from John (2 : 1-11). Here, Jesus took time out to attend a wedding feast in the village of Cana with his mother, Mary and his first few disciples.

*Jewish weddings were steeped in tradition and ritual. One of the customs was providing an extravagant feast for guests.)*

However, something went wrong at this wedding and they ran out of wine. In Jewish culture, such a mistake would have been a great humiliation for the bride and groom. At Mary's request Jesus turns six stone jars filled with water into wine. This miracle shows Jesus' supernatural control over physical elements like water and marked the beginning of his public ministry. Like his other miracles, it benefitted people in need.

What is of great significance here is the symbolism in this first miracle of Jesus. The water that Jesus transformed came from jars used for ceremonial washing. The water signified the Jewish system of purification, and Jesus replaced it with pure wine - representing his blood that would wash away our sins.

While running out of wine is far from a life-or-death situation, Jesus intervened with a miracle to solve the problem. It is believed that this is a reflection of God's interest in every aspect of our lives. So, in other words what matters to you - matters to him.
