ADVENT IS HERE : TIME TO PREPARE FOR THE COMING OF JESUS

Advent is traditionally a time for preparing for Christmas. At assembly on Friday we placed the Advent wreath on our sacred space and spoke about its significance during this important time. The **Advent wreath** is an evergreen circular garland that represents our continuous life with Christ. Four candles are placed inside the wreath. Three of these are purple and one is pink. The purple represents hope, peace and love; while the pink represents joy. One candle is lit for each of the four weeks of Advent. A white candle known as the Christ candle stands in the centre. This is lit on Christmas Eve and reminds us that Christ is the light of the world.

In the parish bulletin on Sunday it was noted that Advent is not only a time for preparing for the Church's celebration of Christ's birth.... but also a time for preparing ourselves for Christ's return in glory at the end of time. Mark's gospel pointed to the concept of watchfulness and the need for staying alert. This is something that we easily overlook in our busy everyday lives. It suggested that our faithfulness to God through the good times as well as the difficult times, shows us to be ready for the coming of the Son of Man.
