

LAUDATO SI: AN ENCYCLICAL LETTER ON THE CARE OF OUR COMMON HOME

The word 'encyclical' comes from the Greek, meaning 'circular'. It refers to a letter that is sent by the Pope with the intent of being circulated among the bishops of the world, or a particular part of the world.

Encyclicals provide instructions that are usually intended for the clergy, the Catholic faithful or other 'men of good will' outside the Catholic Church. The title of the encyclical is always taken from the first words of the opening sentence. For example, if the first words speak of marriage, then the encyclical is about the Sacrament of marriage. If the first few words speak of love, then the content of the encyclical would be about love.

As a general rule, the official version of the encyclical is always written in Latin. In some cases, when the encyclical is directed to one nation only, the official version may be in the language of that land.

Encyclicals are used mainly for teaching, sometimes to caution, and in a few cases for condemnations. The first encyclical was released

by Pope Benedict XIV on December 3, 1740. Since then, the Popes have written nearly 300 encyclicals. LAUDATO SI' is the recent encyclical letter on Ecology and Climate by Pope Francis.

David Schutz, author of Inform's – A guide to Reading Laudato Si' suggests that Pope Francis is a man on a mission and has been since he chose the name 'Francis' at his election. He points out that everyone knows St. Francis of Assisi: the saint who loved poverty and the poor, the saint who praised God the Creator by singing of his creatures, the saint who forsook all his earthly wealth for the sake of the Gospel. Schultz continues by saying that it is no surprise that 'Papa Francesco' has made the poor, the environment and the proclamation of the gospel his mission.

In short, through Laudato Si' Pope Francis challenges us to think about the damage that human actions and attitudes have on our relationship with God, with creation and with each other.


REAL SCHOOLS PARTNERSHIP PARENT INFORMATION EVENING




School Holiday Workshops at Mission Arts.
