Triple P - Positive Parenting Coaching

Who is this for?

Parents of children up to

Triple P can help you

- encourage behaviour you like
- · become confident as a parent
- · deal with a problem behaviour
- take care of yourself

Is this for you?

Nost of the time, parenting is great fun - you know you are doing a pretty good job. But there are times when things get a little tricky. Perhaps you can't take your daughter shopping because she throws a tantrum every time. Or maybe you have a child who makes bedtime a nightmare. Or maybe your child never seems to listen, if only someone could give you some ideas to make those times easier! Triple P Coaching provides middone that is tailored to habe used. guidance that is tailored to help you with your situat

What is Triple P Coaching?

This is a brief and private way for parents to get Triple P support. There are usually about four sessions (sometimes more, sometimes less). It will just be for you (and your partner, if you wish) and our Parenting Promotion Officer Dembra Conlon. There will be no other parents at these individual sessions.

Where do I get it?

Triple P Coaching is provided by VPG through their Every Family Initiative. VPG is based at 158a Edith Street, Innisfail. Give Dembra a call on 0488 321 605 or email dembra@vpginc.com.au

What happens at the sessions?
You will talk with Dembra about your situation and the problem you may have. You will discuss what might be causing your you may have. You will obscuss what might be causing your child to behave in a certain way and work out what changes you would like to see in your child's behaviour. You may be shown a DVD that shows other parents dealing with similar situations. Dembra will give you some suggestions and a tip sheet to help remember some of the positive parenting

How long do the sessions take?

A session can last anything from 15 minutes to half an hour-over 4 sessions that's just 2 hours. Just 2 hours, that could help you turn your family life around!
