

#### OCTOBER: THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. This is mainly due to the fact that the



liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7<sup>th</sup>. It was instituted to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection and guidance she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful. During October, we are reminded of the importance of uniting our prayers with the Mother of God and conforming ourselves to Christ as revealed in the mysteries of His life.


When praying the Rosary, believers focus on the joyful mysteries surrounding His birth; the <u>luminous mysteries</u> of His ministry of teaching and healing; the <u>sorrowful mysteries</u> of His passion and death; and the <u>glorious mysteries</u> of His triumph and resurrection.

So why pray the Rosary?

It is suggested that one reason may be because it can benefit anyone at any stage of their spiritual life from beginners to the advanced. The 'Catechism of the Catholic Church' teaches about various types of prayer including **vocal prayer**, **meditation** and **contemplation**.

The Rosary is a vocal prayer, a meditation and can lead to contemplation (a higher form of prayer). Praying the decades (10 Hail Marys) of the Rosary is not necessarily about focusing on the meaning of each word of each prayer. Rather it is more about pondering the mystery for that decade. The Rosary is a prayer of the gospels as we not only reflect on the gospel scences, but most of the prayers are also taken from Scripture verses.

In this month of October, it is suggested that we consider this beautiful prayer of the Rosary as a way of drawing closer to Jesus and Mary.





There will be no staff at school on this day as they will be attending compulsory seminars at other venues. You will need to make arrangements for the care of your child/ren for this day. Thank you.


### TUCKSHOP

MONSTER GOOSE – perhaps you have a donation for a goose prize?


