

Again in the Temple, the Apostles were excitedly pointing out the beauties of the works that had been added since they had last seen it, when Jesus soberly told them how ephemeral it all was. The whole complex would be destroyed utterly, so that not a stone would be left standing on a stone. His grim prediction would all too literally come true. In the year 70 the whole weight of the Roman army, having besieged the city for three years broke through, destroyed the city and razed the Temple to the ground. It was never rebuilt and all that remains is the great western wall, the substructure of Herod's immense courtyard of the gentiles, sometimes called the Wailing Wall.

Jesus saw in this destruction an augury of the end of the world. "For, he said, "Just as the mighty Temple in all its beauty would not long survive, neither would the world itself."

The end will come after a great deal of distress, some man-made through war and strife, some natural as the very heavens fall in upon themselves. Then the whole thing will be wound up, as the Son of Man returns with splendour and majesty. It behoves us so to live that when that second coming does occur, it will find us ready to meet him.

Yet we must remember that the timing of the event is unknown, Jesus says even to himself, so that all the many predictions of the "end time" must be without validity.

That the world will come to an end is certain, when it will come to an end we do not know; but we must gird our loins and so conduct ourselves so that when it does come, we will be prepared.

The Pastor's Pen

A person phoned recently and early in the conversation after mentioning their name asked, "Do you remember me?" At that point I honestly recall that I had no recollection of this person so I asked for some clues; where and when had we met and were there any specific circumstances? It didn't take long and the person's name registered, I was able to recall an image, a face and occasions when we had met and conversed.

While I was processing this data I was conscious that my caller was not just 'hanging on' but there was a sense of urgency that I knew who I was talking to, after all the caller knew me and had taken the initiative to phone me, so there was at stake pressure for me to remember.

Later I reflected 'what if I was unable to recall this person,' who obviously knew and trusted in me, there would be no context for conversation, no story, no warmth, no identity, other than vagueness, nothingness.

Memory, the capacity to remember and recall, is a much treasured gift. It is essential as a life skill, it also is pivotal to the practice of our faith in the Mass, as we respond to Jesus' invitation on that Holy Thursday night: **"Do this in memory of me."**
