PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As the end of year looms I am now pleased to inform you that staffing has been completed for next year. Classes and teachers are listed below:

After consultation with staff and many hours of discussion I am confident that this class structure is the best fit for our school in 2016. The Year 5/6 composite will be bigger in size than what we have been used to in recent years, however will be assisted by the employment of Mrs Magnanini for extra hours and the allocation of more school officer time. Mrs Magnanini will also be teaching the Year Three and Six classes Maths, as well as assisting with Technology. The current Year Two class is to be split into two multi-age classrooms, 2/3 and 3/4. I realize there is a social stigma attached to "composite" classes but many of these are archaic based on structures of years gone by and perhaps parents experience in their own education. A multi-age classroom has many benefits to the younger children as well as the older ones:

Modeling: One major advantage to children in multiage classrooms is the modeling that takes place. Younger students will imitate academic and social behaviors demonstrated by older children. In addition to this unintended, natural modeling, older students can also provide direct instruction to younger students. When older children 'teach' newly learned skills to younger classmates, they strengthen their own understanding of these skills.

Real Life Setting: Students in a multiage classroom have an environment with increased similarity of the real world. Certainly, grouping students strictly by age does not reflect a naturalistic life-like setting in which people of different ages learn from each other.

Leadership: Every year or two, students in multiage classrooms become the experienced students in the room. This phenomenon leads to the natural assumption of leadership roles in play and classroom activities. Children who would be reluctant to take charge in a graded classroom have a greater sense of responsibility because they are the oldest in the class, and try various leadership roles. The assumption of these responsibilities increases the confidence of the older students as well. Since older students develop their leadership skills, younger students are given opportunities to engage in more complex activities than they could initiate on their own.

Character Building: Multiage classrooms provide older students with the valuable experience of developing their nurturing skills. These skills, crucial to parenting, manifest themselves naturally in a mixedage setting. Mixed-age grouping can provide older children with the opportunity to be helpful, patient, and tolerant of younger peers' competencies, and thus give them some of the desirable early experiences of being nurturing that underlie parenting and helping others who are different from oneself. The presence of younger children also helps antisocial older children. Younger children are particularly helpful in reducing the isolation of socially withdrawn older children. Also, helping others can help older students' sense of self-confidence. Being needed and admired by less able students improves a student's self-concept.

Community: In a group of children of different ages, competition is reduced and the atmosphere is generally collaborative. The group becomes a supportive family. Competition among students is replaced by a growing sense of community. There is less bullying, more taking turns, and greater social responsibility. Work in cooperative groups also improves because of the varying ages. The children in a multiage classroom form a cohesive parent group and learn to support each other rather than to compete.

I ask parents of the Year 2 children to come sometime this week and see me if they have any requests for their child's placement next year. Class lists will be distributed in the last week of term.

I recently asked if there was anyone within our school community who would like to take over the responsibility of mowing the lawn. At present I have had no interest so am putting it out there again in case someone missed my first request.

If you have a child who is in Year Four next year who will be receiving their sacraments, please contact the parish office on 40616633 to register your child's name, so that Lisa has an indication of how many children will be involved in the program.

At our final P&F meeting for the year yesterday morning, Fr Kerry informed us that the parish will be going ahead with the construction of a toilet on the side of the church. I urge all parents who are involved in the building trade to keep an eye out for the tenders for the job which also involves the building of toilets at Christ the King, Mourilyan and St Rita's Babinda.

We are hoping this week to take delivery of ten new i-book laptops purchased with the money raised from our Trek for Tech. Once again thank you for your efforts with fundraising to make this possible.

On Wednesday December 2nd I invite all parents, grandparents and friends who have given generously of their time to help in school activities during 2015, to attend a morning tea in their honour, at 9am in the little hall. Your assistance with swimming, tuckshop, P&F activities, classroom helping, trek for tech, under 8's day, to name a few is very much appreciated and helps lighten the load. We hope to see as many people as possible there.
