

# PRINCIPAL'S END OF YEAR REPORT 2015

2015 started with an enrolment of 105 students, in 6 classes from Prep to Year 6. An odd feel was through the school with

the absence of the Year 7 classs. Even today we mistakenly say Year 7 instead of Year 6. We started the year with 68 families. Although Fr Kerry has not been able to attend all of our meetings, we appreciate how busy he is now having to take on the responsibility of St. Rita's Babinda as well and I thank him for his involvement and commitment to our school, and his hands on approach. The children enjoy his regular visits for liturgies, masses, reconciliation and class visits.

St. Rita's has continued to grow in 2015. We are excited about the approval by BGA committee for the refurbishment of the toilet block and an extension to administration space incorporating a new staff room and meeting room, as well as document storage space.

Thank you. It is because of your commitment we are able to offer our children a significantly broader range of curriculum experiences.

Homework club has run successfully again in 2015. Working parents have found this service invaluable. It has also helped parents who were having difficulty getting their children to do homework. Parents must remember to sign their children in either in the morning or at the beginning of the week. This service has also been beneficial with gaining some of our new enrolments.

Mr Rossi's commitment to sport, and his generously giving of his own time to run sporting clubs of an afternoon once again throughout the year, has been well accepted by the children. The children have thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity and their skill at a variety of sport has improved. Even more rewarding is that there are children from Prep to Year 6 undertaking the activities. The decision to move to the Innisfail District Sporting Association has proven very successful with the children thoroughly loving being involved in Friday town sport. We even had an Age champion (Naveah Galea) at the district sport day and we came runners up in the tug-of-war. Just goes to prove you do not have to go to a big school to succeed. The senior students were once again involved in the North Queensland Futsal Championships and our children held their own against the big schools in Cairns. Four of our students went on to compete at the Queensland championships, Jessica and Luke Magnanini, Braden Venables and Mikayla Camuglia. Mikayla was selected to join the U'12 Australian girls team to compete in Barcelona. This is the second time a girl from St Rita's has had this opportunity.

Jessica Magnanini completed in the Peninsula Touch and Netball teams and Anna-Louise Celledoni was selected as a shadow player in the Peninsula Softball team.

To my wonderful staff the students at St Rita's certainly benefit from the extra mile you go. The children have benefitted once again from having the 6 classes and I thank Catholic Education Cairns for their commitment to small schools however in 2016 we will return to 5 classes. If numbers pick up we may be back to six in 2017. Class structures for 2016 will be slightly different from 2015 with the introduction of another multi-age class with the Year Three class being split into the two multi-

Denise in her performing art role has brought a wealth of knowledge to the position and I thank her for her dedication and the wonderful job she does. Once again she has accomplished great things with the children in Performing Arts lessons. They entertained patrons at Mother's Day Morning Tea, lead actions at the Catholic Education Week Mass, as well as shortly at our annual Christmas concert.

Donna will continue her role as Learning Support Teach and in 2016 will also be undertaking the position of Curriculum Support Teacher. Donna has helped children with areas of learning difficulties throughout the year. Many hours have gone in to tailoring lessons to aid children improve their learning. Her efforts ensure that the children in the school who need that extra bit of support to aide in their learning receive all the help they can, assisted by our school officers. She has also liaised with various outside agencies to help her in her role.

I would also like to thank the ancillary staff, Santina, Jenni, Sandy, Maria, Jo, Grandma Beth, Judy and Lisa for their tireless work behind the scenes to help with the effective running of administration, the library and classrooms. Your efforts are gratefully appreciated.

Following the release of the 2015 NAPLAN results, plans have been put in place for intervention in the new year. On completing the Naplan analysis day with Donna, Rebecca Harris, Curriculum Officer CES and myself our children have compared favourably with those schools across the diocese and state. One area of concern even though we fared well in comparison to other schools, is spelling and this is to be addressed in the new year

This year we sadly say goodbye to our ten Year 6 students. I have to commend the year 6 students for stepping up into the role of leaders of our school following Year 7 being transferred to high school. From all reports although daunting this time last year, the Year 7 students have settled into secondary school life. 10 wonderful children will shortly walk through the gates of St. Rita's as students for the last time. Some of these children have been with us for 7 years some have joined us on the way.
