## THE HOLY SPIRIT WILL TEACH YOU



The new city of God is built on the foundation of the apostles, but on its gates are inscribed the names of the tribes of Israel. These names represent the openness to all nations, races, peoples and tongues. The resurrection of Jesus has radically transformed the way we live together and the way we live with God.

What must we do to be saved? The question put to Jesus centuries ago is still asked today, and the answer is still the same. We must believe and we must love God and love one another. We will be recognised as resurrection people by our

active faith and by our unselfish love, not by an exterior mark, regardless of how sacred. This change in requirements for membership does not diminish the rigour of our religious obligations. Rather, it suggests that we may always have to reinterpret the law, for what is appropriate at one time and in one place may be inappropriate in another. With the early Christians, we will need the guidance of the Holy Spirit in this very delicate process. This is why the departing Jesus assures us that the Spirit will come to us to teach us all things.

The final gift that Jesus promises to give is his own peace, a peace that he has won by overcoming sin and death. This peace issues from the union that Jesus enjoys with God, a union which we are now invited to share.

#### The Pastor's Pen

This week we celebrated the Feast of the Evangelist Mark, interestingly he is identified as **John Mark** in Acts and as **Mark my Son**, in a Letter of Peter.

As **John Mark** he accompanied Paul and Barnabas on a mission to Cyprus and Antioch and for some unexplained reason he returned from that mission.

After returning he settled in Rome and grew in his friendship with Peter, Peter later identifies Mark as his son, perhaps Peter may have baptised Mark. This change of direction and the growing friendship with Peter encouraged Mark to utilise his talents for writing, so he penned accounts of the life of Jesus and what evolved, is what we accept to-day as the first of the Gospels, the shortest, 'The Gospel of Mark' and written between the years 66-74.

In one sense the missionary life was not for Mark, he had the courage of his convictions to change direction while not giving in to the negatives and failure and once recollected, other doors opened: his friendship with Peter and his passion to recall and write--- no one will ever know the influence Mark may have had on **Matthew, Luke and John** being the trailblazer, nor will we ever know the real impact Mark has had on searchers who continue to ponder over his account of the life of Jesus!

Seems God's hand was at work, still Mark was free to make his choice.
