#### **FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI:**

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

On Sunday we celebrated The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – or the Feast of Corpus Christi as it is also known. This is a special time to celebrate the belief in the body and blood of Jesus Christ's real pres



blood of Jesus Christ's real presence in the Eucharist.

#### THE WORD: LUKE 9:11-17

After Jesus finished teaching the crowd, the people were very hungry. The disciples came to Jesus – they had only five loaves and two fish and there were more than 5000 men. Jesus took the loaves and fish, said the blessing and gave them to the disciples for the people. They all ate their fill and there were twelve baskets of scraps left over.

#### **LOOK CLOSER**

Jesus shows us that he cares deeply for his followers. He nourishes us not only spiritually, but physically as well. The feast of The Body and Blood of Christ (or Corpus Christi in Latin) reminds us that Jesus gives us his own body and blood so that we might live with him forever.

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

We pause to give special consideration to the Bread of Life nourishing our lives. When we break bread and share one cup we recall that sacred meal between Jesus and his disciples just before he died on the cross. For Catholics, Eucharist is the one of the most important aspects of our shared faith. Receiving the Body of Blood of Christ deepens our union with him and calls us to communion with one another.




