PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

7 June 2016

I have just received notification that the extra funding has been approved for our building, so now we will finally see some progress. I will shortly be meeting again with the builder to go over final details. We now have to pray for good weather so we can catch up on the weeks of work the project is now behind.

Thank you to everyone who was involved with last Friday nights disco, making it was the success it was. It was great to see our students interacting with students from other schools all having loads of fun and entering in the competitions.

It is timely to remind parents about privacy and that the work teachers have in their classroom, no matter where it is, **is not** for parents to be searching through. Each child has the right to privacy as well as my staff. If you wish to know about your child's progress please talk to the teacher directly. St Rita's has always had an open door policy therefore it would be a shame if classrooms have to be locked when teachers are not there due to the misguided actions of a minority of parents who may spoil it for those who do the right thing.

Last Thursday we successfully completed our external audit. The panel was extremely pleased with what was happening in our school based on information gained from interviewing the leadership team, staff members, parents and our school leaders. From this process there will be some recommendations made to guide us in our planning for the future of the school. In the coming weeks I will be bringing you some information around the new strategic direction of Catholic Education Cairns.

As part of our own analysis of classroom practices for our recent audit, and ongoing professional development, a term that you will be hearing more of around our school is 'Visible Learning'. Children identifying what they need to be a successful learner, and recognizing when they have successfully learned a topic. The focus is on the steps needed and what they have to do in the future to take themselves to the next level. This Friday I will be taking four of our Year Six students, Tamsin Darveniza, Summer Dunne, Tyla Plumb and Hamish Hunter to participate in the Readers Cup at St Joseph's School, Parramatta Park. The children have all had to read a series of six books and will undertake activities based on these books on the day. This is the first time we have undertaken this activity so I wish them well. It will be a learning experience for us all.

We are very proud to announce seven of our students have had their illustrated prayers published in this year's Mini Vinnies' *Little Book of Prayers*. Congratulations to Jack Lodge, Kari Cini, Poppi Parmenter, Jason Robinson, Kohan Spry, Hamish Hunter and Zarah Stanley.

This week I am absent at a number of workshops, which continue into next Monday when Miss Watkins and I will be attending a Down Syndrome conference in Townsville.


<u>WHAT TIME IS IT?</u> The return to Ordinary Time began last Sunday. This simply refers to the period of the Catholic

Church's liturgical year that falls outside of the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter.

Often people think this refers to the parts of the church year that are unimportant because of the 'connotations' associated with the term 'ordinary' but this is so far from the truth.

Ordinary Time is called 'ordinary' because the weeks are numbered. There are 33 or 34 weeks of Ordinary Time each year and these are divided into two periods. The first occurs between Christmas and Lent and the second between Easter and Advent.

The Latin word 'ordinalis' that refers to numbers is derived from the Latin word 'ordo' from which comes the English word 'order'. So in fact, Ordinary Time basically means the ordered life of the Church – the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting nor in penance, but rather reflecting and celebrating our call to follow Jesus each and every day.



GOSPEL CONNECTIONS: LUKE 7: 11-17 Young man, I say to you, arise

Last Sunday's gospel from Luke is more about Jesus' response to the plight of the widowed mother than the restoration of life to her son. For this reason, Luke's Gospel is often called the 'gospel of compassion' and in it is a great example of Jesus being emotionally moved by what he sees. The widowed mother has lost her only means of support – her only son. A woman at that time only had status through her husband or her sons. This widow has lost everything and her grief and tears move Jesus to 'feel sorry' for her. He restores her son to life and returns him to his mother. The response by the crowd is just as it should be: they are filled with awe and praise God. Their words show that they have truly recognised the significance of what they have just witnessed: 'A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people'.

Speaking of compassion...the Church

has always engaged itself in acts of service to those in need. As a Catholic school community we too are called to follow this example. One of the very important ways that we do this is through our support of the St. Vincent de Paul Society led by our Minnie Vinnies group. And, there is never a more crucial time to do this than during the season of winter. During the coldest months of the year, it is vital that Vinnies has the resources it needs to assist the most marginalised and vulnerable members of the community.

This winter, the St Vincent de Paul Society is urging all Australians to **'Rethink Homelessness'**, particularly with statistics now showing that 59% of Australians seeking help from specialist homelessness services are women. This is significantly higher than the UK's 26% and the USA's 38%.

What is even more alarming is the fact that the fastest growing group experiencing homelessness is women over 55. This totally contradicts the common myth that homelessness mostly affects younger men.

Our Minnie Vinnies group here at St. Rita's will meet this week to discuss and formulate an action plan for the coming weeks and Term 3. Stay tuned for more details about how we will raise funds and raise awareness to help the St. Vincent de Paul Society tackle this most devastating problem. 
