### "CHRIST IS RISEN! ALLELUIA!"



### Welcome back everyone and Happy Easter to you all.

The most joyful week of our year began on Easter Sunday (only a few days ago). It is called the Easter Octave. An octave is an 'eight day' celebration. With this in mind however, Christians carry their Easter joy with them through the whole year.

Easter is too important to last only one day, so the church gives us seven weeks to celebrate, to sing and to be joyful. Jesus is risen and he is with the Church, to teach and to guide us until the end of time. A very prominent theme of Eastertime is *light*. At the Easter Vigil, the paschal candle was lit from the Easter fire and carried into the darkened church. The congregation sang, '*The Light of Christ*' and responded, '*Thanks be to God.*' This new paschal light will burn brightly for the 50 days of Easter and is a symbol of the risen Jesus, the '*Light of the world*' whose light was not put out with death but shines now for all believers to see.

The daily readings of Eastertime are filled with *good news.* They tell of the women and Peter who find the tomb of Jesus empty, of excited disciples running to tell one another of the risen Jesus. And as we move through the second week of Easter we will read stories about Jesus appearing to his disciples after his resurrection. All of these readings proclaim that, in Christ, life has conquered death and light has triumphed over darkness. Naturally then as we return after our Easter break the first thing to do is to make our prayers ring with 'ALLELUIA !

There will be no Storytime on Thursday 8 May, but the Your Tutor service for online homework help will be uninterrupted.
