RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

WHY DO WE HAVE SO MANY CEREMONIES AT EASTER?

The *Easter Triduum* refers to three days in the Church's calendar which express the central mystery of our Christian faith. It begins on *Holy Thursday* as we focus on Jesus' farewell words and deeds at the Last Supper. *Good Friday* is when we ponder the events of his suffering and death. It finishes with the *Easter Vigil* when we celebrate the liberation of humankind through Christ's resurrection. This three-stage sequence of worship allows us to take in an enormous mystery in small parts and to relate it to our own lives – the sorrows, joys,

successes and failures. Of all of the Church's celebrations throughout the year, the *Easter Triduum* is considered the highpoint. The following is a list of the Church ceremonies that will take place during this special time of remembrance.

HOLY THURSDAY - 2nd April Mass of the Lord's Supper (7:30 pm –Innisfail) <u>GOOD FRIDAY</u>- 3rd April Stations of the Cross (10.30 am – Innisfail) Reconciliation (11.30 am – Innisfail) The Lord's Passion (3.00 pm - Innisfail) <u>HOLY SATURDAY</u> – 4TH April Reconciliation (11.30 am - Innisfai) Easter Vigil (8.00 pm – Innisfail) <u>EASTER SUNDAY</u> – 5th April Easter Celebration (7.00 am – South Johnstone) (9.00 am – Innisfail)

It would be wonderful if the children of our school could attend one or some of these significant ceremonies of our faith. Understanding and embracing the real message of Easter, Jesus' death



and resurrection, is a very special and very important part of what it means to be a Christian.

OUR JEWISH CONNECTION

The *Passover* is the highlight of the Jewish calendar. It celebrates God's victory over the Egyptians who had enslaved the Israelites. When the Pharaoh refused to let the Israelites leave, the Lord sent an angel of death over the land killing the first born of every animal and family. But it <u>passed over</u> Israelites as they had faithfully celebrated the meal and marked their door posts with the blood of the slaughtered lamb.

Understanding the rich meaning of the *Passover* as a message of deliverance, Jesus used this meal to reveal to his disciples his willingness to be put to death in order that they too would be delivered from sin and evil.

Parent teacher interviews online



There are still

approximately 20 parents who have yet to book an interview. It is important to book and attend an interview with your child's teacher.

Interviews are only 15 minutes in length, which is a very valuable 15 minutes for your child's education. An opportunity to discuss your child's progress and any areas of issue.

It only takes a minute or two to book. The instructions appear later in the newsletter for those yet to book.

It only takes a minute or two to book. Here are the instructions again for those who have yet to book –

- Go to the school's home page: www.stritascps.qld.edu.au
- Click on the 'Links & Logins' button at the bottom right corner of the home page
- Click on the 'Parent/Teacher Interviews Online' link

 \fbox Enter your surname and PIN, provided on the attached slip

IF YOU CAN'T FIND YOUR PIN - Click "Obtain PIN/Password" and enter your email address. Your PIN will be emailed to you. The email you receive will include a link that can be clicked on to log straight into PTO, bypassing the login screen.

When you have made all the bookings you require, you can download or email a report of your bookings. Simply click on the printer symbol at the top of the page. You can log in and *change bookings* any time **up to 7.00pm on the day prior to your interview.**

If you see this symbol displayed along side your child's name, it means this teacher recommends that you book an interview.
 Other parents may be making bookings at the same time that you are using the system. It is possible, though unlikely, that a time slot is displayed to you as available, but

is then booked by another parent shortly afterwards. If you then attempt to book this time slot it will not be available and a message will be displayed to indicate this. If you encounter any problems using PTO please contact the school office by phone on 4064 2153, or by email to secretary.johnstone@cns.catholic.edu.au.
