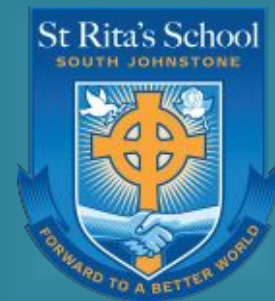

survey data is collated by an external source and later in the year a report will be sent back to the school on findings, congratulating us on what we are doing well and making recommendations for improvements.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS



ST. PATRICK: PATRON SAINT OF IRELAND MOST OF US KNOW SOMETHING ABOUT ST. PATRICK AND THE WEARING OF GREEN ON HIS FEAST DAY. THE FOLLOWING FIVE FACTS MAY HELP US BETTER UNDERSTAND THIS AMAZING MAN AND HIS REMARKABLE LIFE STORY.

1. March 17th is when St. Patrick died.

St. Patrick is a saint of the Catholic Church, and his holy day is the day of his death, not the day of his physical birth. After spending most of his adult life converting the pagans of Ireland to Christianity he died on March 17, 461 AD.

2. St. Patrick wasn't Irish.

St. Patrick was not born in Ireland. His parents were Roman citizens living in Britain (either Scotland or Wales – scholars cannot agree on which).

3. Patrick was a slave.

At the age of 16, Patrick had the misfortune of being kidnapped by Irish raiders who took him away and sold him. He spent several years in Ireland herding sheep and learning about the people there.

4. St. Patrick used the shamrock to preach about the Trinity.

Many claim that the shamrock represents faith, hope and love. It was used by St. Patrick to teach the mystery of the Holy Trinity – how three beings, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit could be separate entities, yet one in the same.

5. Legend says that St. Patrick drove all the snakes from Ireland.

In reality, this probably did not occur, as there is no evidence that snakes ever existed in Ireland, the climate being too cold for them to survive. Scholars suggest that the term 'snakes' may be figurative and refer to pagan religious beliefs and practices rather than actual reptiles.

6. Patrick's original is blue.

The original colour associated with St. Patrick is blue, not green as commonly believed.

In several artworks depicting the saint, he is shown wearing blue vestments. King Henry V used the Irish harp in gold on a blue flag to represent the country. Green was associated with the country later, presumably because of the greenness of the countryside, which is so because Ireland receives plentiful rain and is today often referred to as the 'Emerald Isle'.

ST. PATRICK'S PRAYER FOR THE FAITHFUL

St. Patrick's prayer for the faithful captures the wonderful spirit that made him Ireland's patron saint and one of the Church's most beloved missionaries. He was so successful in preaching the gospel and organising the Church in Ireland that he is largely credited with converting the Irish to Christianity. St. Patrick's prayer for the faithful, much like the famous Breastplate Prayer also attributed to him, can truly inspire us to ask for divine assistance in living our faith each day.

May the Strength of God pilot us.
May the Power of God preserve us.
May the Wisdom of God instruct us.
May the Hand of God protect us.
May the Way of God direct us.
May the Shield of God defend us.
May the Host of God guard us.
Against the snares of evil ones.
Against temptations of the world.

May Christ be before us !
May Christ be in us,

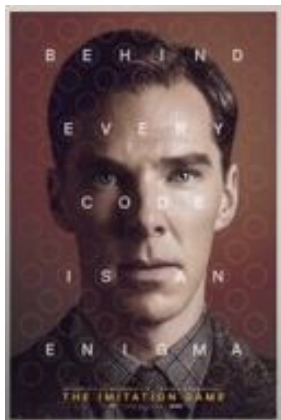

PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS ONLINE



At the time of writing the newsletter 33 families have already booked their Parent/Teacher Interviews. It only takes a minute or two to book. Here are the instructions again for those who have yet to book –

- Go to the school's home page: www.stritascps.qld.edu.au
- Click on the 'Links & Logins' button at the bottom right corner of the home page
- Click on the 'Parent/Teacher Interviews Online' link
- Enter your surname and PIN, provided on the attached slip
- **IF YOU CAN'T FIND YOUR PIN** - Click "Obtain PIN/Password" and enter your email address. Your PIN will be emailed to you. The email you receive will include a link that can be clicked on to log straight into PTO, bypassing the login screen.
- When you have made all the bookings you require, you can download or email a report of your bookings. Simply click on the printer symbol at the top of the page. You can log in and *change bookings* any time **up to 7.00pm on the day prior to your interview.**
- If you see this symbol  displayed along side your child's name, it means this teacher recommends that you book an interview.
- Other parents may be making bookings at the same time that you are using the system. It is possible, though unlikely, that a time slot is displayed to you as available, but is then booked by another parent shortly afterwards. If you then attempt to book this time slot it will not be available and a message will be displayed to indicate this.
