Just a reminder to parents that school starts at 8.50 am. Children arriving after this time will have to be signed in through the office. Children arriving after 9.00am will be marked absent for the morning session unless prior notice has been given to the office. The morning bell therefore will be ringing at 8.45am to ensure children are ready to start work at 8.50 am.

This year our school is changing our homework policy in accordance with research data on the effectiveness of different types of homework activities in primary schools. A copy of the new policy has been emailed to you with this newsletter.

Our P & F prides itself on their commitment to our school.

#### **RESOURCE LEVY**

Students will begin receiving their books today. The school charges an annual Resource Levy of <u>\$140 per child in Years 1 –</u> <u>6 and \$160 per child in Prep.</u> This covers the purchase of text books, exercise books, class sets, photocopying and some consumables. Payment of the Resource Levy would be appreciated by the <u>13 February</u> to enable us to pay our accounts. If you are experiencing difficulties please contact the school office. Parents who are direct debiting fees on a weekly/fortnightly basis are asked to please pay the resource levy either by EFT or into the school office, either by cash or cheque made out to the school.

## BELL TIMES

School officially starts at 8.50am and concludes at 3.05pm. Students will be supervised from 8.20am to 3.30pm. Please note – late arrivals and early departures must come through the school office. The Attendance Book on the office counter must be signed by parents at drop off/pick up.

## **MOBILE PHONES**

## SCHOOL FEES -METHODS OF PAYMENT

Term 1 School Fees will be run next week. These fees will include Instrumental Music.

Please note the following IMPORTANT INFORMATION -

If paying your fees in full over the internet please use your SURNAME, FIRST NAME/S as a reference and use the following account details bsb 084-352 a/c 000005018 a/c name: RCTC St Rita's School Sth Johnstone

If you are setting up regular internet payments you must use your REFERENCE NUMBER followed by your Surname as a reference; and please use the following account details – bsb 084-352 a/c 000017401 a/c name: RCTC St Rita's School Sth Johnstone

Whilst cash payments can be made at the office **any day except Wednesday**, EFT payments or Direct Debits set up through the office are the two **PREFERED** ways to pay your fees.

Please note that BPay is available, however does costs the school a small amount of money. You will find the biller code on your statement. IN THIS CASE, YOU WILL NEED TO USE YOUR NUMERIC REFERENCE NUMBER.

The system will address the fee statement to the primary caregiver which is often the Mother or Female Guardian unless we have other arrangements formalised. Although the fee statement is addressed to an individual, the financial obligations undertaken by parents at the time of enrolment, or any more current fee paying agreement, will still stand. Where there is a change in the relationship between parents/guardians, notification of any change in financial obligations must be provided to the school. The documented change must be signed and acknowledged by all parties involved.

#### FLOOD PLAN

Our procedure if flooding occurs is as follows:

- Parents need to use their judgment with regards to getting their children to and from school safely.
- School will only be closed after consultation with the local police.
- Only if the school routine is changed will an announcement be placed on Radio 4KZ and Kool FM between 7.00am and 7.30am.
- In the event that school is to close once classes have begun, then parents will be notified according to residential location.
- If buses are sent from Innisfail to pick up students who travel home by bus, Trans North will notify the school so that parents are contacted to ensure someone is home to meet the bus. No students will be permitted to travel on the bus if parents have not been contacted.
- If you are ever unsure of safe school travel, contact the school before leaving home.
- Be assured no students will be left at school unattended.
- Extra caution needs to be taken when travelling on wet roads and don't drive through water.
- Parent, student and teacher safety is paramount.
