## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Thank you to the parents who have taken time out of their busy schedules to attend Parent/Teacher meetings this week. If you are unable to attend please contact the class teacher who will provide you with a handout of items discussed at the various meetings. Parents just be reminded that if you have a personal matter to discuss, do so after the meeting. During the meeting is not the time to do this.

As a matter of urgency and child safety, parents who are insisting on parking outside the designated parking bays behind parked cars in the staff carpark (which is utilised by Prep parents) are asked to stop this activity, or the area will be closed to parental parking for the safety of our young students. The other issue that has been raised is parents parking illegally (too close to the carpark exits on Green Street). This greatly restricts visibility of oncoming traffic. Unfortunately this almost ended in disaster yesterday with a parent narrowly missing an oncoming car. In school drop off times Green Street is actually a no-standing zone. Considerable expense was outlaid to erect the walkway to the back gate to have a safer parking option. I would also bring to your attention that the carpark near the post office will be decommissioned during the building project as it will be part of the building site. Therefore it is probably a good idea to begin getting used to parking in Driscoll Street and walking in.

Tomorrow at 11.30 am we will be holding a short liturgy in the church, for Ash Wednesday. Everyone is welcome to attend. Talk with your children about Lent and what they can do at home. Lent is a time to get ready for Easter and with young children we emphasise the performing of good deeds rather than giving something up. This is very pertinent this year with the special "Year of Mercy" announced by Pope Francis.

Just a reminder to keep next Monday morning free for our P&F AGM. Thank you to the parents who have already been in contact with the office notifying us that they are unable to attend.

Over the coming few weeks, teachers will be attending several professional development days. Unfortunately they are during term time but all effort is made for the smooth running of the classroom. Teachers inform the students of their absence so that the children know they will have someone different teaching them the following day.

Next Friday is our first assembly for the year. Everyone is welcome to attend. Assembly usually goes for around 40 minutes. Don't forget the "Helping my child with reading at home" workshop following assembly.

I am hoping you have all made arrangements so you can attend the Mark Davidson behaviour management PD on Monday, 22<sup>nd</sup> February at 7pm. If you have absolutely no baby sitters and are keen to attend, please notify the office.

School fees were issued last Friday. Parents are encouraged to pay these as soon as possible, as you can imagine there are a lot of expenses to start the new year. Thank you to the parents who have paid their Resource Levy. Just a reminder that this levy must be paid by the end of this week.

Congratulations to our school leaders who were inducted last Friday at our opening school mass. The leaders' badges will be issued next Friday at our first assembly. I would like to congratulate all the children on their behaviour during mass given that it was possibly the hottest day of the year to date.

#### **LENT**

#### **BEGINS THIS WEEK:**

LENT is the Christian season of preparation before Easter. It is a special time in the Church calendar when followers of Christ observe a period of <u>prayer</u>, <u>fasting</u> and <u>almsgiving</u>.

Put simply, the purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ – his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial and resurrection. LENT is celebrated by Catholics of all ages and is a time for us to try to become more prayerful, to make our lives simpler and to share what we have with those who are in need.

LENT lasts for 40 days and is a fairly serious time as we recall the period that Jesus spent in solitude in the desert before he began his preaching ministry.

LENT is an occasion for us to participate in self-

examination and self-renewal. We are encouraged to think about what the gospel means to us and to think about how well we are living up to God's law of love. For many it can be a time of great change.



#### **CELEBRATING 'PANCAKE TUESDAY':**

Today we celebrated **Pancake Tuesday** or **Shrove Tuesday** as it is the last day before the period of **LENT** begins. As **LENT** is traditionally a time of abstinence, of giving up things or self-sacrifice, this day is the last chance to indulge a little.

Pancakes and other sweets are often eaten on this day because they are typically rich in fat, butter and eggs which historically were foods restricted during Lent. The Tuesday before Ash Wednesday has become known as the last day of celebration and feasting before the period of fasting begins.



#### **CELEBRATING ASH WEDNESDAY:**

Tomorrow we will begin our Lenten journey with **Ash Wednesday.** This marks Day One of our forty day experience as we prepare to celebrate Easter. Our Whole School celebration will be in the Church at 11.30 am

As Fr Kerry began his annual holiday period this week and Fr Nathan is unavailable, this will be a Liturgy of the Word during which the class teachers will distribute the blessed ashes among the members of their class.

During this time a cross of ashes will be placed on each child's forehead. This is a powerful sign of our belief in God and serves as a reminder of our promise to follow Jesus. Basically, when we

receive the ashes we remember that we are members of God's family and that we are called to be faithful to the gospel through our words and actions. Parents are most welcome to join us.



#### A FEW INTERESTING FACTS:

- Last year's palms are burned to make the ashes for Ash Wednesday
- The colour purple is the colour for the season of Lent
- Purple is often associated with mourning, which anticipates Christ's pain and suffering on the cross; and royalty which celebrates his resurrection
- Many people choose to observe a 'no meat on Friday' rule during Lent
- Lent ends on Easter Sunday
- Lent is derived from an Old English word which means 'lengthen'
- The last week of Lent is called Holy Week
- The number 40 is significant in Jewish-Christian scripture

Wishing you all a wonderful week and an inspiring and refreshing Lenten season.
