## **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS**

# SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT: THE TRANSFIGURATION

Last Sunday was the second Sunday of Lent. The gospel from Luke (9:28-36) recalls a very significant time for Jesus and for his followers. It commemorates the mysterious event known as the <u>Transfiguration</u>.

This event is hard to understand. Why did it happen? What did it mean?

Here are a few points that international author, speaker and popular blogger Jimmy Akin suggests we need to know in order to understand the Transfiguration a little better.



### 1. What does the word 'transfiguration' mean?

It comes from the Latin roots '*trans*' – (across) and *figura* – (form,shape).

It therefore signifies a change of form or appearance.

This is what happened to Jesus in the event known as the Transfiguration: His appearance changed and became glorious.

### 2. Who witnessed the Transfiguration?

The three who are privileged to witness the event are Peter, James and John, the three core disciples. The fact that Jesus only allowed three of his disciples to witness the event may have sparked the discussion which swiftly ensued about which of the disciples was the greatest. (Luke 9:46)

### 3. Where did the Transfiguration take place?

Luke states that Jesus took three "on the mountain to pray."

This mountain is often thought to be Mt. Tabor in Israel, but none of the gospels dentify it precisely.

4. Why did the Transfiguration take place? The Catechism (book of beliefs of the Catholic faith) explains it this way: Christ's Transfiguration aims at strengthening the apostles' faith in anticipation of his Passion: the ascent onto the 'high mountain' prepares for the ascent to Calvary.

- 5. What does Luke in particular—tell us about this event?
  - He notes that this happened while Jesus was praying
  - He mentions that Peter and his companions 'were heavy with sleep, and when they wakened they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him'
  - He mentions that Peter made his suggestion to put up booths as Moses and Elijah were departing.
- 6. Why do Moses and Elijah appear on the mountain?

They represent the two principal components of the Old Testament: the Law and the Prophets. Moses was the giver of the Law, and Elijah was considered the greatest of the prophets.

The fact that these two figures 'spoke of his departure, which he was to accomplish at Jerusalem' illustrates that the Laws and the Prophets point forward to the Messiah and his sufferings.

### 7. What can we learn from this event?

The Transfiguration was a unique event in which God allowed certain apostles to have a privileged spiritual experience that was meant to strengthen their faith for the challenge they would later endure. But it was only a temporary event, It was not meant to be permanent.

In the same way, at certain times in this life, God may give certain members of the faithful special experiences of his grace that strengthen their faith.

#### God our Father, You bid us to listen to your Son, the well-beloved. Nourish our hearts on you word, Purify the eyes of our mind, fill us with joy at the vision of your glory. We make our prayer through our Lord. AMEN
